WELCOME TO GRAND RAPIDS COMMUNITY COLLEGE!

GRCC is a public two-year college located in downtown Grand Rapids, the second largest city in Michigan.

The college serves over 25,000 (credit and non-credit) students a year and has a faculty and staff of over 900.

The main campus consists of eleven (11) buildings and two parking structures. GRCC operates its Occupational Training programs at the Leslie M. Tassell M-Tech® located at 622 Godfrey Street SW, and the Laboratory Preschool at 227 E. Fulton Street. Classes are also offered at centers throughout the Kent Intermediate School District and in the nearby cities of Holland and Zeeland. GRCC also operates the Wealthy Street Learning Corner located at 1154 Wealthy St SE. GRCC does not have residence halls.

Our campus is considered to be safe. We are however, subject to many of the same problems that occur in the surrounding communities. Grand Rapids Community College is concerned about the well being and safety of students, employees and visitors and has prepared this brochure to increase your knowledge of the current programs that exist for your protection. Personal safety tips that are useful both on and off campus have been included.

THE JEANNE CLERY DISCLOSURE OF CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY AND CAMPUS CRIME STATISTICS ACT OF 1998

In 1990, the U.S. Congress enacted the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act, (Title II of Public Law 101-542) which amended the Higher Education Act of 1965. This same act has since been amended in 1992, 1998 and 2000. The 1998 amendments renamed the law the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act.

Grand Rapids Community College prepares this report in order to comply with the Clery Act. The college compiles a report that not only lists statistics on certain crimes that are reported on campus, but also reports on security policies the college maintains. The act requires campuses to report occurrences of the following crimes: Murder/Non-negligent manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, sexual offenses, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, arson and hate crimes. The act also requires that the following arrests and judicial referrals that occur on campus be reported: liquor law, drug abuse and weapons violations. The crime reports are made available to all current employees, students, prospective students and employees and anyone requesting a copy. THE GRCC POLICE DEPARTMENT

The GRCC Police Department is located in room 418 of the Main Building and may be contacted by calling (616) 234-4010 to request police service. In the case of an emergency on campus, you can call 4911 from any College phone. You can place an emergency call to the Police Department using public telephones located throughout the campus buildings, by dialing (616) 234-4010. You can also use the **BLUE EMERGENCY CALL BOXES** located in the GRCC Parking Ramps, the Calkins Science Building and the Applied Technology Center. Information on the individual location of the emergency call boxes is listed below.

The Grand Rapids Community College Police Department is a team of professionals responsible for maintaining a safe environment in which the educational mission of the College can be fully realized. The Police Department is service oriented and tailored to meet the needs of a large urban centered institution.

GRCC Police Officers have completed the training course required of all law enforcement officers in the State of Michigan. Throughout the year they receive additional in-service training directed towards the special needs of the college such as bike patrol, investigative techniques, interviewing skills and similar law enforcement functions. Every officer is trained to provide first aid, CPR and in the use of the AED.

The officers are commissioned under state law and have full law enforcement authority and responsibility. GRCC Police Officers investigate all criminal incidents occurring on campus.

The Department's ability to operate at this level enables it to provide a sensitive, measured approach to all situations requiring police service. GRCC Police Officers also work closely with the Grand Rapids Police Department, Kent County Sheriff's Department, Michigan State Police, Federal Bureau of Investigation and other law enforcement agencies.

By mutual agreement with other state and federal law enforcement agencies, the GRCC Police Department maintains a Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) and a National Law Enforcement Telecommunications Network (NLETS) terminal. Through the use of these systems, police personnel can access database information on criminal histories, nationwide police records, driver and vehicle information as well as receive important broadcasts on issues such as stolen vehicles, Amber Alerts, wanted individuals, severe weather warnings, etc. The GRCC Police Department's use of this system is audited by the Michigan Department of State Police on an annual basis.

Many visitors and first time students are unaware of the services that we provide. The following is a list of the things we can do for you:

- Emergency assistance in the case of injury or severe illness.
- Protection of persons and property – Officers on foot patrol, police bicycles and the use of fully marked and unmarked police cars allow flexibility and mobility in patrolling the campus area.
- Motorist Assists – open locked vehicles, jump start dead batteries
- Crime prevention and reporting
- Parking and traffic enforcement
- Escort Service to your car, or from building to building
- Maintain the College’s lost and found service
- Make emergency notifications
- Enforce City, State and Federal laws and local ordinances



BLUE EMERGENCY CALL BOXES

The **BLUE EMERGENCY CALL BOXES** can be used to contact the GRCC Police by pressing the speaker button. Activating the speaker will allow you to interact with the Police Communications Center.

BLUE EMERGENCY CALL BOXES are located in the following places in the Bostwick Street Parking Ramp:

- One on each of the six levels on the Bostwick Street side of the ramp.
- One on each of the six levels on the Ransom Street side of the ramp.
- One on each of the six levels on the Student Center side of the ramp.

BLUE EMERGENCY CALL BOXES are located in the following places in the Lyon Street Parking Ramp:

- On each of the seven levels at the northwest stairwell.
- On each of the seven levels of the south stairwell.
- At the Bostwick Street entrance to the Lyon Street Ramp.
- At the Lyon Street catwalk that connects the Lyon Street Ramp to the North Building.

The College also has interactive emergency call boxes in the Calkins Science Building on all five floors in the north, south, east, and west corners of each floor.

The Applied Technology Center (ATC) has interactive emergency call boxes:

- Outside the west door of the parking ramp
- First floor outside room 124 plus in the classroom hallway
- Second floor in the Atrium and in the classroom hallway
- Third floor in the north hallway

The emergency call boxes are not to be used for cars with dead batteries, keys locked in vehicles, etc. Individuals with these types of problems may go to the GRCC Police Department, 418 Main, for assistance. The call boxes should be used to summon the police to physical injury cases, crimes in progress, suspicious people/vehicles, disorderly person(s), etc.

Elevators:

All campus elevators have interactive speaker phones that can be used in case of an emergency. The phones ring directly into the GRCC Police Department. Should you need assistance while you are on the elevator, press the call button that is clearly marked inside the elevator panel.

The elevators can become very congested at certain times of the day, particularly in the North/Main buildings. We are asking you to be sensitive to the needs of mobility-impaired students, guests and staff and allow them to enter the elevator first.



REPORTING PROCEDURES

The GRCC Police Department does everything in its power to fulfill its service-oriented goals. To be completely successful however, it needs the assistance of students, staff and visitors.

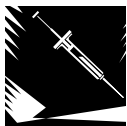
If you are the victim of a crime on campus, please contact the GRCC Police Department to make a report of the incident. The incident will be documented and a follow up investigation conducted. This documentation/investigation will allow the GRCC Police to identify potential problem areas, refer the accused individual through the student disciplinary system and if necessary, prosecute the individual in the appropriate court of law. It also ensures that the annual reported crime statistics will be accurate.

During your time on campus, if you witness a crime, suspicious person or incident, contact the GRCC Police Department (616-234-4010 or 4911). Your awareness and input are essential to campus crime prevention. Please don't let someone else become a victim.

If an incident occurs off campus, the GRCC Police or the Dean of Student Affairs (616) 234-3925 will assist you in contacting the appropriate law enforcement agency for reporting purposes.

The GRCC Police Department prepares written reports of all criminal activity as well as written reports for vehicle accidents. All reports are strictly confidential. Copies of incident reports may be obtained from the GRCC Police in room 418 of the Main Building. Before receiving a copy of the report, you will have to complete a Freedom of Information Act form. The form will be provided to you upon request at the GRCC Police Department.

A crime/dispatch log is available for viewing in the GRCC Police Department (room 418 of the Main Building) during normal business hours.



POLICY ON THE USE OF ALCHOL AND DRUGS

The faculty, staff, and students of Grand Rapids Community College are expected to observe all federal, state and local laws, in addition to the College policies that regulate the use and possession of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, and dangerous drugs. All students, employees and visitors are expressly forbidden to use, illegally sell, or possess alcoholic beverages, narcotics and dangerous drugs or to be under the influence of same while on College property.

GRCC students and student employees are prohibited from unlawful possession, use, manufacture or distribution of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, or psychologically or physiologically altering chemicals while on campus.

A student or student employee who illegally uses or sells alcoholic beverages or controlled substances on GRCC's campus, or while representing the College faces College disciplinary action and prosecution under local, state and federal law. Sanctions may include but are not limited to mandatory counseling, evaluation, testing, suspensions, expulsion, and/or termination as a student employee.

Any College employee who illegally uses or sells alcoholic beverages or controlled substances on GRCC's campus, or while representing the College faces College disciplinary action and prosecution under local, state and federal law.

To assist persons in avoiding substance abuse problems and related health risks, students may seek free, confidential counseling in the Counseling and Career Center by scheduling an appointment. Students are also encouraged to attend College substance abuse/awareness workshops, seminars and classes that are held throughout the academic year. The Counseling and Career Center can be reached by calling (616) 234-4130.

POLICY ON CONCEALED WEAPONS

In the interest of public safety for its employees, students, customers, visitors and the general public, the carrying of weapons, whether open or concealed is strictly prohibited on any College property. No person whether licensed or unlicensed shall carry firearms, or other weapons on College property as defined herein except as set forth in this policy.

Employees are strictly prohibited from carrying a firearm on College property or while in the course of their employment for the College whether they are licensed or unlicensed as provided for under the Concealed Weapons Act.

The use of a firearm or weapon is strictly prohibited on any College property except for those areas specifically set aside and supervised at range facilities or as a part of the educational process conducted by the College.

Exceptions:

This policy does not apply to GRCC Police Officers or other law enforcement officers who are lawfully carrying weapons in the course of their duties as law enforcement officials.

Persons who are unauthorized to carry concealed weapons, except for employees who are prohibited from carrying concealed weapons by GRCC, are subject to the limitations set forth in this policy in accordance with the Concealed Weapons Act.

Statutory Provisions:

The statute permits employers to bar their employees whether licensed or unlicensed from carrying concealed weapons on employer property or in the course of their employment.

Persons who are licensed under the state statute to carry a concealed weapon are required by law to carry his/her concealed weapons license at any time he/she is carrying a concealed weapon. A licensed person is required to show to a peace officer upon request both his/her license to carry a concealed weapon and their driver's license or Michigan Personal Identification card.

Limitations

State law prohibits a licensed individual from carrying a concealed weapon on the College premises under any of the following circumstances: while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance; or in a dormitory, classroom, day care center, sports arena or stadium, entertainment facility that has a seating capacity of 2500 or more; or a dining room bar or restaurant licensed under the Michigan Liquor Control Code. Persons who violate this provision are subject to both criminal and civil sanctions.

Reason for Policy:

To prohibit the possession or use of weapons or explosive devices on College property, as defined herein, for the safety of its employees, students, customers, and the general public.

Entities Affected by this Policy:

Staff, students, vendors, visitors to the campus and the general public.

Definitions:

“College property” includes but is not limited to property owned, operated, managed, licensed to or leased by the College.

“Weapons” means any type of firearm, knife, dagger, dirk, stiletto, a double-edged non-folding stabbing instrument, brass knuckles, or any type of instrument which could be used as a weapon and any type of explosive, chemical, or objects or instruments possessed for use of fighting or attacking.

“Official Purpose” means GRCC Police Officers or other law enforcement officers from city, county, state or federal law enforcement agencies while performing duties or services for the College or in the course of their employment as law enforcement personnel.

Violations of Policy:

Employees or students who violate this policy may be subject to corrective action up to and including termination of employment or expulsion from the College where applicable. Additionally, violators of this policy may also be subject to civil or criminal sanctions as provided for by law. Visitors, customers or the general public, who violate its policy, will be subject to criminal sanctions and/or removal from College property by GRCC Police Officers. Persons who are licensed to carry concealed weapons who violate the provisions of this policy are subject to criminal and civil sanctions as provided by law.



SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY AND ACCESS TO RELATED INFORMATION

Upon release from prison, individuals convicted of sex crimes in the State of Michigan, are required by state law to register their home address with their area law enforcement agency. In addition, if registered sex offenders are enrolled at, or employed at a post secondary institution, the offenders must also provide this information to the state through their local law enforcement agency. The State of Michigan maintains the information regarding convicted sex offenders at <http://www.mipsor.state.mi.us/>. In order to use this website, you must enter either a zip code, or name and approximate age of an individual. The Michigan Public Sex Offender Registry is also available on the United States Department of Justice Sex Offender Public Registry. The Department of Justice sex offender website at this printing contains information on offenders from 22 states. Multi-state information can be located at <http://www.nsopr.gov/>.

TIMELY WARNING

In the event that certain crimes or situations exist that are considered to pose a threat to the college community, the Clery Act requires the college to notify the college community in a timely manner. This determination will be made when reports come to the attention of the Chief of GRCC Police or the Chief's designee, or the Dean of Student Affairs. The college will make timely notice to the college community by utilizing options such as the college newspaper, radio stations, fliers distributed to the college community, electronic mail (e-mail, GRCC Today), World Wide Web (www.grcc.edu), etc. Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should share this information with the GRCC Police Department either by phone (234-4010) or in person.

SEXUAL ASSAULT PROCEDURES

Students or employees who are victims of rape, acquaintance/date rape, or any other sexual offenses are encouraged to notify law enforcement authorities. Victims, if they choose, can elect to have a college employee assist them in notifying the correct law enforcement agency, should the assault have occurred off campus.

GRCC's Counseling and Career Center provides counseling for victims of sexual assault. In addition, the Counseling and Career Center can provide students and employees with additional information on the availability of counseling and support services in the community.

Option # 1

The victim of a sexual assault should report the incident as soon as possible. In order to protect important physical evidence, victims should not shower, bathe, brush their teeth, or change their clothing prior to going to the hospital. A change of clothes will be needed to wear home from the hospital. If applicable to the situation, the student should maintain the scene as exactly as it was at the time of the assault.

A hospital is the only place where evidence necessary for forensic and/or medical evaluation and court testimony can be collected. In order to be useful, physical evidence should be collected within 12-24 hours and no later than five days after the assault. Medical protocol also involves testing for sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy. Your contact with the hospital and the collection of medical evidence does not mean that criminal charges will be automatically filed against the assailant.

Option # 2

Any student victim of a sexual assault that occurred on campus may file a report with the Dean of Student Affairs (234-3925). The Dean of Student Affairs is responsible for dealing with all issues that require disciplinary action. (The specifics of this process can be found in the handbook entitled, "Student Conduct Policy, Student Code of Conduct, Discipline Grievance Procedure.")

Per the Clery Act of 1998, both the victim and the accused (if the accused is a GRCC student) are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding, and will be informed of the College's final determination, any school disciplinary proceeding with respect to the alleged sex offense, and any sanction that is imposed against the accused.

The College may impose the following sanctions toward a student found responsible through the College Discipline Procedure for rape, acquaintance/date rape, or other sex offenses, forcible or non-forcible: verbal warning, reprimand, social probation, requirement of restitution, community service, and/or dismissal from the College.

If requested by the victim, assistance will be made available in changing academic situations after an alleged sexual assault incident if such changes can be reasonably made.

Any college employee who is sexually assaulted on campus by a GRCC employee or student, and wishes to have the incident handled by the institution, can contact the GRCC Police, (616) 234-4010, or the Director of Human Resources (616) 234-3975.



SECURITY ON CAMPUS

The Facilities Department manages the buildings and the grounds on campus with the utmost concern for the safety and security of our staff, students, and visitors. The parking structures, building entrances and main campus walkways are well illuminated. Care has been taken in landscape planning and lighting to assure that the entrances to all of the campus buildings are visible from a distance.

Access to academic buildings is limited to the hours of operation in that particular building. The hours of operation will differ from building to building. After hours use by students is prohibited unless special permission is received from a college official in advance. Access control for the college is the responsibility of the Chief of GRCC Police.



FIRE DRILL AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

During the academic school year, GRCC is required to hold fire drills in order to comply with city and state safety requirements. To assist students in evacuating classrooms and directing them to safety, faculty is asked to take a few minutes during class periods to review the following:

1. Review the Fire Drill Procedures, location of exits and students' responsibilities in case of emergencies.
2. Identify exits and "Handicappers Evacuation Areas" that are near your classroom.
3. Identify students who can assist wheelchair users in getting to the "Handicappers Evacuation Area" on the third floor of the Applied Technology Center and the second, third, and fifth floor of the North and Main Buildings. **DO NOT USE THE ELEVATORS.**
4. After checking the door frame for heat, close windows before exiting the room and close the doors upon leaving the room.
5. Exit and take your class across the street from the building and wait until the "ALL CLEAR" is given by GRCC Police Officers. **DO NOT STAND ON PEDESTRIAN WALKWAYS OR BLOCK EXITS.**
6. Missing or injured students or employees should be reported immediately, verbally or in writing, to the Chief of GRCC Police in 418 Main Building, (616) 234-4010.

TORNADO EVACUATION PROCEDURES

In the case of a tornado incident, the goal of Grand Rapids Community College employees is to minimize physical injury and increase the possibility of survival. By familiarizing ourselves and our students with the Tornado Evacuation Procedures, we can meet this goal.

Moving persons from higher floors to lower, windowless areas of GRCC buildings enhance our chances for survival. Wheelchair users should immediately report to designated alternative shelter areas, avoiding the use of the elevators.

A **Tornado Warning** is when a tornado is actually spotted in the area.

A **Tornado Watch** is when conditions may result in a tornado.

DESIGNATED ALTERNATIVE SHELTERS – Small, interior and windowless rooms such as restrooms or corridor areas may be used.

Avoid windows, parking ramps, catwalks or pedestrian walkways.

The Kent County Civil Defense sirens will provide the primary warning of a tornado. Sirens are tested at 12 noon on the first Friday of each month.

Faculty members should inform students of the tornado warning, turn off the lights, take class roster books with them, direct students to the appropriate shelter area and close the doors.

Following the “All Clear” signal, college staff should report the names of injured persons to the GRCC Police in room 418 of the Main Building or by calling (616) 234-4010.

Note: Each building has its own tornado safety instructions posted in a public area.



SAFETY AND AWARENESS TIPS

The GRCC Police Department is committed to providing a safe campus. In keeping with this goal, individual safety is a priority.

The information contained on the following pages has been compiled to provide students, faculty, staff and visitors with a better understanding of measures that can be taken to provide a safer environment in which to work, study and live. Hopefully the personal use of this information will help prevent you from becoming a victim and will assist the Officers and the college community in establishing the safe atmosphere we all desire.

Personal Safety

- If at all possible, try to avoid studying alone. If it becomes necessary, always let someone know where you are and an approximate time when you will be finished.
- Keep your books or personal belongings in view at all times. Never leave them behind, even for a second to use the restroom or get a drink. Carry purses and backpacks securely.
- Trust your instincts. If you suspect something is wrong, or you feel uneasy about a situation, do not ignore the feeling. Move to a safe location.
- Avoid dangerous situations. Use your best judgment in deciding where you will go and what you will do.
- Walk on the well lit, designated College walkways.
- Walk with friends or classmates. If that isn't possible, contact the GRCC Police at 4010 for an escort to your vehicle.
- Walk facing traffic when possible.
- When off campus, avoid shortcuts through dark areas, vacant lots and other deserted places.
- Learn the locations of the Emergency Blue Call Boxes on campus.
- Walk confidently and assertively. An assailant looks for someone vulnerable. If you suspect that you are being followed, turn or cross the street. If you are being followed, use a Blue Emergency Call Box or campus phone to call the GRCC Police. Find a "safe" area to proceed such as an office, highly visible area, or place where there are people that can see you.

- Always keep your keys in your possession. Keys can be duplicated.
 - Reports all thefts to the GRCC Police immediately.
 - If you observe an individual in an improper restroom, leave immediately and call the GRCC Police at 4911.

VEHICLE SAFETY TIPS

- Have your keys in your hand before you reach your vehicle.
- Check the interior of your vehicle before entering it.
- Plan your route in advance and try to travel well-lit streets.
- Keep your car doors locked and your windows rolled up.
- If you have a flat tire in a questionable area, drive on it until you reach a safe, well-lighted area.
- When parking your vehicle at night, select a spot that is well illuminated.
- If you believe you are being followed, **DO NOT DRIVE HOME**. Stay on busy streets and drive to a police department or busy public place.
- Wear your seatbelt. Place children in approved car seats or safety belts.
- Vehicle thefts from vehicles do occur on campus. The items most frequently stolen are book-bags, purses, cellular phones, CD players, unattached speakers and other items considered valuable that can be seen inside your car.

Protect your vehicle by:

- Mounting stereos and CD's on a bracket that allows you to remove them and place them in your trunk.
- Take loose articles with you or place them in the trunk.
- Engrave your stereo and other belongings with your driver's license number.
- Use a locking gas cap to prevent fuel theft.
- Install locking lug nuts and locking hubcaps.

Check the *Student Bulletin* and the *Collegiate GRCC Police Update* to be aware of campus crime incidents.



GRCC DAY CLASS CLOSING DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER

A process is in place at the College to determine if GRCC should close due to inclement weather. If classes are cancelled, the media will be notified. Students and employees should listen to WOOD Radio for GRCC closings and/or announcements. CRIME DEFINITIONS

Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter

The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Negligent Manslaughter

The killing of another person through gross negligence.

Robbery

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated Assault

An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

Burglary

The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Motor Vehicle Theft

The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Weapon Law Violations

The violation of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses regulatory in nature, such as: manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons, concealed or openly; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.

Drug Abuse/Use Violations

Violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include: opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); marijuana; synthetic narcotics (Demerol, methodone); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine.)

Liquor Law Violations

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting: the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned. (Drunkness and driving under the influence are not included in this definition.)

Sex Offenses (Definitions derived from the National Incident Based Reporting System Edition of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program.)

Forcible

Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.

Non-forcible

Incidents of unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse such as incest and statutory rape. Incest is defined as non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law. Statutory rape is defined as non-forcible intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

Arson

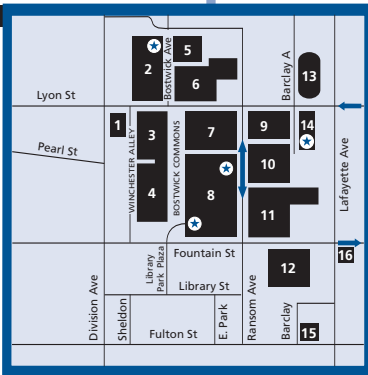
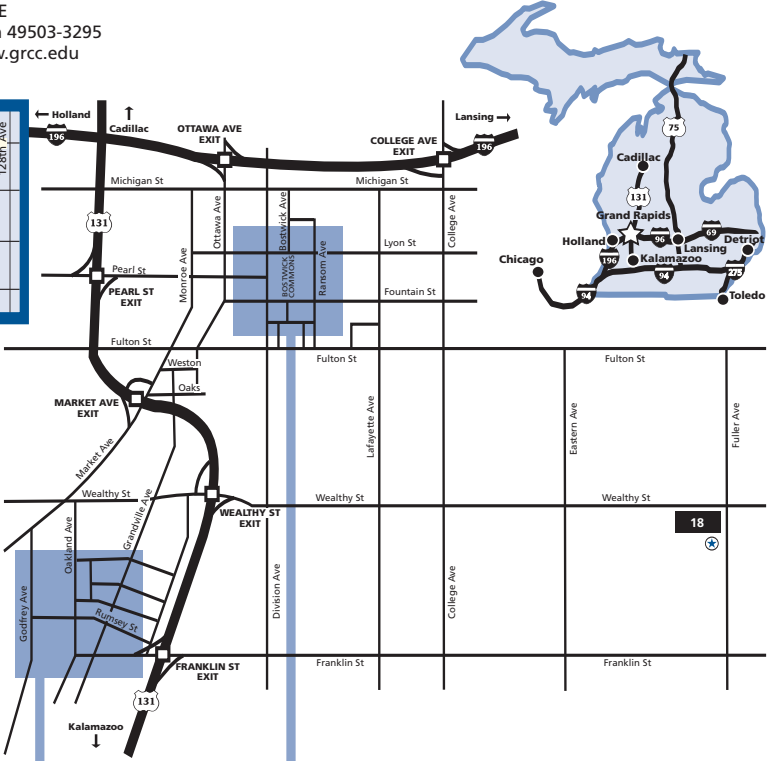
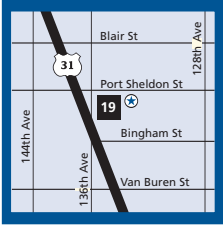
Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another etc.

Hate Crimes

Any criminal offense that manifests evidence of prejudice based on race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity/national origin or disability.
